There, 143 excited children eagerly awaited this special day. It was the day they were going to get a complete makeover: hair cut and styled, complete with photos.

Most orphan children receive a basic utilitarian haircut as needed, but rarely if ever do they get the opportunity to pick a stylish new look. But the kids from Guliopole got to shine that day – with photos to remember!

"We prayed about what we could do to encourage these children. They have been isolated due to COVID. Then the Lord just gave me the idea," Said Antonina, Heart for Orphans' Transition House mother in Zaporizhzhia, Ukraine. When Antonina shared her idea with the hairdressers, they got excited and wanted to participate.

The orphanage director and staff were so thrilled to see the joy on the faces of the children. They asked our team if they could please come again. The children chimed in also, "Oh yes, please, please! Will you come again?" When we share our gifts and talents many are blessed!



# **A NEW** BEGINNING!

*Sixteen* of our kids have given their lives to Christ since May being raised from the water symbolizes Jesus rising from of 2020! These orphaned children made the decision to become water baptized and that decision is not taken lightly. It is something to be CELEBRATED!

Before baptism, kids participate in a Bible study course on the meaning of baptism. They study for months! Through their study, they learn what it means to be water baptized and that it is a way to visually preach the gospel. Standing in the water symbolizes Jesus dying on the cross; immersing in the water symbolizes Jesus being buried in the tomb; and

the dead.

Our kids may never experience an earthly adoption, but they may all experience a spiritual one. By choosing to be baptized, they are answering God's call! They are choosing to give up their old habits and die to self. It is a new beginning!

# THE RESCUE

My name is Natasha and I am 19 years old. I was born into a large family in a little village in Ukraine. We had eight children in our family, but sadly I didn't grow up with my sisters and brothers. In fact, our family fell apart because my parents were alcoholics.

Two of my brothers died before they reached one year. Two of my sisters were adopted and I never saw them again. When I was little, my older sisters were removed from the family and sent to the orphanage. Finally, when I was seven years old it happened to me. I was also sent to the orphanage. I was so scared! I cried and was afraid that everyone would forget about me. Fortunately, I was only there for five years.

I found out that my older sister, Yulia, had lived there also, but a Christian family took her home and raised her. Now she was grown and married. We began to call each other and she came to visit me.

Once I called her to get our mother's phone number. Autumn break was coming up and I wanted to go home and see my mother. I missed her so much! Yulia did not have the heart to tell me that my mother was still drinking heavily. So instead she invited me to come to her house. I was so excited that I cried! I couldn't wait!

The week with Yulia and her husband Kolya was unforgettable, and it flew by. I was so sad when it was time to leave. I didn't want to go back. On the drive back to the orphanage I got a huge surprise - Yulia and Kolya asked if I wanted to stay with them forever! I immediately shouted YES! I cried and hugged them, and I said to Kolya, "Thank you! I promise to always obey you!"



out teens. When Natasha came to live with them in 2012 they began to take younger children also. Hope House is now a Foster Support Home, with children of all ages. Heart for Orphans currently supports two Foster Support Homes.

When I came to live with them I did not know anything at all about Christ. I thought it was strange to dress up, go to church, sing songs and read the Bible. I just didn't understand. Over time I began to look forward to it. I loved Sunday school and enjoyed the Christian summer camps.

One summer there was a missionary speaking at camp. He asked, "Are you interested in what the Lord is preparing you for?" I felt like he was speaking directly to me. I had no peace, and I knew I needed to be reconciled with Christ. I repented and asked the Lord into my heart. Over the next year I studied the scriptures in preparation for baptism. On July 5, 2020 I was baptized in water. I am now a new creation in Christ! I am so excited to see God's plan for my future. I want to serve him in everything I do!
