Great News from Our Newest Home: Ruth's House Dedication

March 5th was a blustery day outside Berdyank, Ukraine, but it didn't dampen the energy inside a small home as fifty of us celebrated God's provision — Ruth's House was officially opened!

We had come together from all over Ukraine and the USA to pray and dedicate our new home to the glory of God. The guests of honor were the residents themselves – the six girls who would call Ruth's House, home.

Joined by the boys from neighboring Mel's House, we listened to one incredible story after another from the kids – how God led them to our homes and how their lives had changed dramatically!



Dinara met Christ while still in an orphanage in the Crimea. The other kids severely beat and tormented her for being a Christian. When it was time to leave, she prayed that God would direct her to believers. Amazingly, she was sent to the trade school in the tiny village where Mel's House is located – almost 300 miles away. She

was surprised to learn that there was a Christian home for orphans in this little village! As she put it, "I'm so happy to live with people who are not hypocrites but genuinely love each other".

.. Update: Mel's House


As part of the festivities surrounding the opening of Ruth's House, we heard stories from some of our boys at Mel's house of how thankful they were for God's provision:

A Sad Wake-Up Call . . .

Karol Saner recently traveled on behalf of her church to see the group homes in Ukraine with Nancy Hathaway. Karol said, "When our church learned about Heart for Orphans group homes, we decided to pray about sponsoring a home. I want to share this story...

In 2005, I spent time in an orphanage in the eastern part of Ukraine. I was accompanied by Kate,16, who was adopted from that orphanage. She was there to translate for me, and say goodbye to her friends who were about to graduate. "When summer comes they will be put out of the orphanage and scatter...I will never see them again," Kate told me. I became fast friends with these girls. One day, several of the girls confided they wanted to ask me questions, and they pulled me into an empty room while their eyes darted around to make sure no one saw them. Kate whispered, "My friends want to know how long it takes to get a baby?" and "Where does the baby come out"? and "How will we know if we have a baby inside"? Each question shocked me more than the last...not because of the nature of the question, but because these girls were about to be turned out into the world without answers to questions they needed to know. "Our caretakers tell us we will never have

a baby because we sit on cold floors...is that true?" I promised to tell them the truth. When the word got out that "babushka Karol" was answering "the questions" the room filled with wide-eyed girls.

Back home several months later I was awakened in the middle of the night by the phone. I recognized the voice as my friend, who was in Ukraine adopting. In the background I could hear wailing. "Sorry to wake you, but the girls are about to be sent away and they are frightened. They don't know where they're going and I don't know what to tell them! They wanted to speak to Babushka Karol". I had such a sick, helpless feeling knowing there was nothing I could do. I prayed and cried with the girls and tried to comfort them as best I could. The girls left that day, each sent to different trade schools. Through the years I was able to keep in touch with only a few. It has been so sad to see those sweet, innocent girls become hardened and sad.

I will never forget the faces of those girls and the fear in their voices the night they called me. Our church's desire has been to sponsor a home, and help the kids we love live like a family. We pray that "our kids" will meet Christ and learn to walk with Him.

Ira's Story of Hope

Hello, my name is Ira. I live in Esther's House. I am getting ready to go on the mission field. I'd like to tell you my story and how God is moving in my life.

I was the youngest child in a large happy family, and I was loved by all, especially my father. My life was good. But the enemy does not sleep. When I was 8, things fell apart. My mother began to see another man, and eventually divorced my father. The new man moved into our house, and before long he sent us kids to live in an orphanage.



Then my beloved father was killed. My life fell apart! I hated my new stepfather and blamed him for destroying our family. I became depressed. Some Christians came

to our orphanage and began to tell us about Christ. They told us that the Heavenly Father loves us so much! But, most importantly, they showed us by example. Their love toward us, and kindness filled my heart with a hope that life was not over. I understood that the Lord is real, and only with Him can a person really be happy in this world.

After graduating from the orphanage, I began to live in Esther's House where my faith grew. The housemother and girls became like a family to me! Soon, I accepted Christ into my heart and was baptized. My life has changed so much! Now, I'm in Bible College and preparing to become a missionary. I leave in a few months for a country in central Asia that has been closed to the gospel. I pray that He will use me for His Kingdom and that His plans for my life would be fulfilled.
